Indigenous carvers arrive at Royal BC Museum Monday July 30

VICTORIA, BC-On Monday, July 30, artists Tom LaFortune and Perry LaFortune of the Tsawout First Nation will arrive at the Royal BC Museum to begin carving a totem pole, the first day of a public carving program the museum is hosting in partnership with the BC Ministry of Health and sponsored by TimberWest.

The LaFortune brothers will be at the Royal BC Museum until early October, carving the roughly seven and a half metre (25 feet) long piece of timber into a finished pole.

They will be on site, on the museum's outdoor upper plaza, until October, from approximately 9:00 am to 5:00 pm Monday-Friday.

Access to the carving station is free, and the LaFortune brothers will be discussing their process and providing interpretation as they work.

The public will be able to track the progress of the carving on a dedicated webpage (rbcm.ca/pole) and on Royal BC Museum social media platforms (Facebook, Instagram and Twitter).

From July 30 to August 3, museum visitors will also have the additional benefit of enjoying TimberWest's First Nation Cultural Art Showcase program from 11:00 am to 4:00 pm daily. Carvers Dave and Johnathan Jacobson of Tsaxis First Nation, carver and painter Tom Hunt Jr. of Wei-Wai-Kum First Nation, cedar weaver Toni Frank of Shishalh First Nation and carvers and fashion designers the Good family from Snuneymux First Nation will all be demonstrating their multi-faceted cultural artwork on the museum's upper plaza.
