Royal BC Museum Spider Seekers Return from the Rockies

Victoria, **BC** – Recently, three spider experts from the Royal BC Museum went on a two-week research expedition to the Rockies to learn about spiders in the area. Find out why researchers are fascinated by these creatures and how much more we still have to learn about them at



The Spider Seekers a free event on Wednesday October 16 from 7 to 9 p.m. at the Newcombe Hall, Royal BC Museum.

Those attending the free talk are invited to "bring along a spider" – alive, dead or photographed – to have it identified.

The three researchers on the Spider Seekers museum team include Dr. Robb Bennett, a trained spider systematist and B.C.'s foremost spider expert; Darren Copley, a dedicated volunteer with the Royal BC Museum and an avid spider collector with impressive identification skills in the lab; and Claudia Copley, the Royal BC Museum's collection manager. Claudia is responsible for maintaining the Museum's entomology collection, which includes over half a million specimens of insects, arachnids, and myriapods.

The Spider Seekers will provide a better understanding of spider biology, talk about what it takes to do spider fieldwork, and share some of the interesting discoveries that they have made through this research.
