Then **think of the Royal BC Museum as Victoria's living room** as you stay to enjoy our warm and welcoming eating area, featuring recycled and reused furniture and décor, creating a relaxed urban vibe.

The Food Truck Festival event is open to everyone. Newcombe Plaza is a courtyard located on the south side of the Royal BC Museum property behind the museum. The festival event runs Sunday to Thursday from 11 am to 6 pm, and Friday to Saturday 11 am to 9 pm.
